3. Activities

a. Publications

The Society published two issues (Volume 45, Numbers 1, 2) of the Mathematical Medley, and the SMO 2019 solution book (edited by Dr Ku Cheng Yeaw, A/P Tay Tiong Seng, Dr Toh Pee Choon and A/P Toh Tin Lam).

b. Distinguished Visitor Programme

The Distinguished Visitor for 2019 was Michael Röckner from Bielefeld University. During his visit, Professor Röckner conducted a Public Lecture entitled *Finding Order in Disorder: Mathematics is Everywhere* on 30th of August, and two colloquia talks at NUS and NTU on 28th and 29th respectively. Professor Röckner was also the Guest-of-Honor of the Society's Annual Prize Presentation which was held on 31st August 2019.

c. Lectures

SMS Lecture Series "Turning Uncertainty into Certainty" by Professor Nicolas Privault (NTU) was held on March 12 2019 at LT33, NUS.

d. Workshops

An SMS workshop for teachers "Student Preparation for Mathematical Olympiads" by Dr Hang Kim Hoo and Mr. Wang Haibin was held on 1 October 2019 at NUS Centre for Quantum Technology Seminar Room. The workshop was well-attended by more than 30 teachers and had received positive feedbacks from the participants. The Society will continue conduct such workshops to engage teachers' interest in mathematical problem solving approaches.

e. Singapore Mathematical Olympiad

- The Society conducted the Singapore Mathematical Olympiad (Junior, Senior and Open Sections) in June 2019. A total of 7572 students from 110 secondary schools and junior colleges participated in the various sections of the Olympiad.
- For Junior Section, there were 3375 participants from 85 schools. For Senior Section, there were 2354 participants from 85 schools. For Open Section, there were 1843 participants from 71 schools. In addition, there were 291 participants from China, Malaysia, Indonesia and Vietnam.

f. International Mathematical Olympiad

i. Singapore Mathematics Symposium

- The 10th Singapore Mathematics Symposium was held on 27th September 2019 at the School of Physical and Mathematical Sciences, NTU
- The symposium featured 3 speakers Vincent Tan (NUS ECE & NUS Math), Wu Guohua (NTU SPMS) and Lim Nengli (SUTD ESD)
- There was also a poster competition opened to graduate students. Nixie Sapphira Lesmana and Ye Zi from NTU School of Physical and Mathematical Sciences were selected by the panel of judges to be the winners of the poster competition.
- The organizing committee for the Tenth Singapore Mathematics Symposium were Nicolas Privault (Chair) (NTU SPMS), Gan Wee Teck (NUS Math) and Ng Keng Meng (NTU SPMS).

j. Singapore Mathematical Project Festival

- The Singapore Mathematics Project Festival 2019 attracted a total of 39 projects. Judging panels, made up of mathematicians and school teachers, were formed to grade the presentation of each team. The grades were used as a reference for short-listing the projects for the final round. Consequently, 6 teams from the Junior Section and 5 teams from the Senior Section were invited to the Festival Congress held at NUS on 30 March 2019.
- The judges for the Festival were Ku Cheng Yeaw (NTU), Cheong Kang Hao (SUTD), Wang Fei (NUS), Teo Kok Ming, Zhao Dongsheng, Toh Pee Choon (NIE)

k. SMS Essay Competition 2019

- The Society organized the 9th SMS essay competition with the theme "Mathematics and Economics". The competition aimed to introduce the students to the different branches of economics, such as microeconomics, macroeconomics, game theory and finance, and to let the students understand how mathematics is applied in them. The competition was officially launched on 12 March 2019 during a lecture of the SMS Lecture Series titled "Turning Uncertainty into Certainty" by Professor Nicolas Privault from NTU.
- The Society received a total of 65 entries from 17 schools with 28 entries for Category A (secondary 1 & 2 or equivalent), 21 for Category B (Secondary 3 & 4 or equivalent), and 16 for Category C (JC or equivalent).

1. Mathematics Teachers Conference 2019

- About 650 participants, mostly local mathematics teachers, attended the Mathematics Teachers Conference 2019 which took place on 7 June 2019 at Nanyang Technological University/National Institute of Education (NIE).
- The event was co-organized by the Mathematics & Mathematics Education Academic Group of NIE and the Association of Mathematics Educators, and supported by SMS. Several SMS members were invited to deliver lectures and workshops for the teachers.
